When I arrived at YWCA's Pathways for Women in Lynnwood, I was ready to break the cycles of poverty, violence, and homelessness that I grew up with.

I had just fled an abusive relationship and lived in my car with my son, Corban, who was diagnosed with autism before his third birthday.

YWCA helped Corban and I stay together, and it wasn't long before they got us back into stable housing.

They helped me learn about self-care, how to improve my overall health, and I created a plan that would guide us toward a brighter future.

Today, Corban is a bright, active, and chatty seven-year-old. I graduated from Edmonds Community College and travel across Washington State to promote equity in housing and health policies.

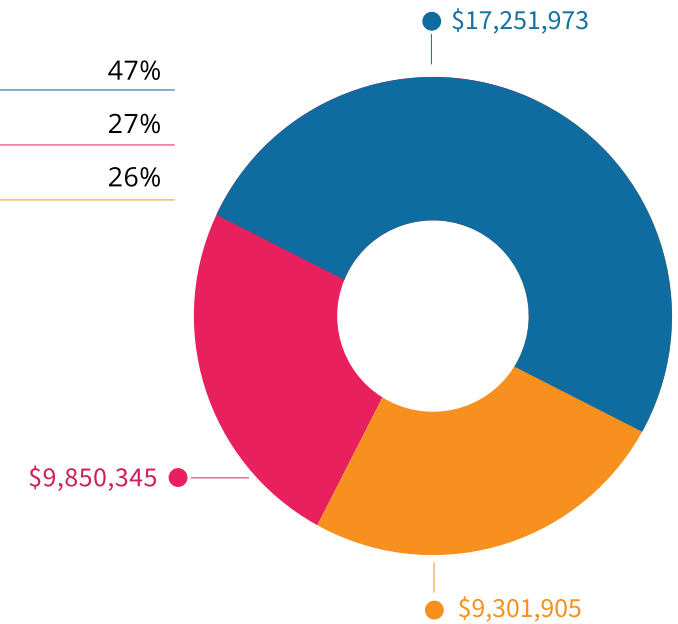

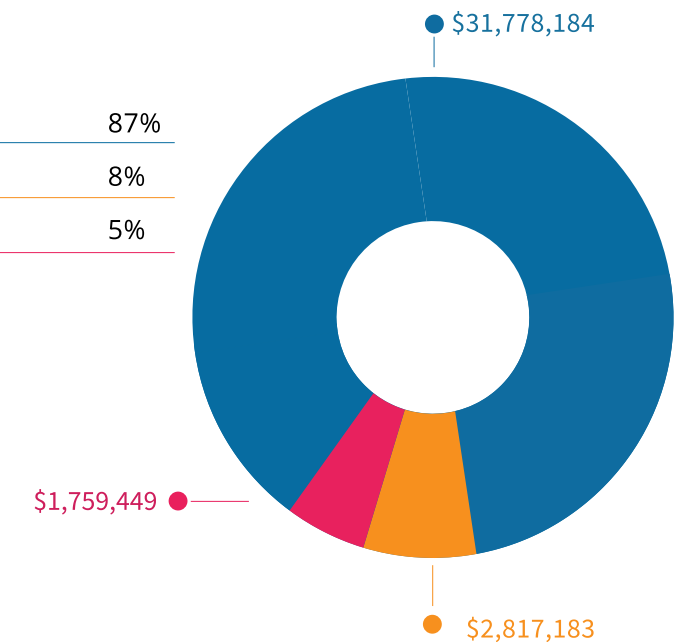
2018 REVENUE \$36,404,223
