# "I can't imagine my life without cancer because I can help people now like they have helped me". ~Resident Pam

In 2012, Pam was diagnosed with Stage 2 Aggressive Lobular Carcinoma. It was a year of determination, strength, and confidence of survival. Pam says, "The things that mattered: money, bills, car repairs, work... are still there, but are now small compared to helping others who are going through cancer. I walked every day no matter how bad I felt. My spiritual faith was important to me and my belief in always looking forward and not back! Contact others who have been through the same type of cancer. They can answer your questions and give you strength. Your doctors will give you contact information. Join a survivor group. It is so uplifting to know you are never alone. I attended many group meetings, met many friends and have been a speaker at events."



Pam now has permanent neuropathy from the chemotherapy treatment, however works part-time at Walgreens to keep busy and be out with people. She has lived at FVI since December 2016 to be closer to family, previously from Texas. Her son-in-law worked for a company that helped build FVI! Pam hopes to see that people coming here new to the community will take more responsibility and help FVI become a more beautiful place to live, and to have the respect for others, property, and life.


