

Program Summary

Somerset Village Apartments are located in Lynnwood and provide permanent housing to large families. In 2018, the property was purchased by YWCA purchased because of its location and size.

This 64 unit of primarily 3 to 4 bedrooms apartments serves large families at risk of becoming homeless with a lower income., typically less than \$40,000.

Somerset Village is positioned close to other YWCA housing in Snohomish County. This allows families the opportunity to access to additional supportive services such as case management, community services, and referrals for health care and job training.

Additionally, Somerset surrounds **Aunt Bette's Community Center**, which provides services specifically for children living at Somerset Village.

Community Challenges

- In the US, mothers are overrepresented among the working poor; more than twothirds bring home at least half of the household's total earnings.
- In Snohomish County, nearly 40% of individuals experiencing homelessness were members of the BIPOC community.
- In 2020 Snohomish County witnessed a rapid loss of lowincome housing (meaning rents less than 800 a month)

Participant Outcomes

- In 2020 YWCA provided permanent housing for more than 2000 people.
- YWCA owns more than 900 housing units. During 2020 income received from subsidized rent was waived to accommodate losses generated by the ongoing pandemic.
- YWCA's approach to individualized care assisted more than 600 people with housing through its rapid rehousing programs.
