

A YEAR OF CHALLENGE AND CHANGE

Everyone in the community, including YWCA's participants, staff, and partners, has been profoundly impacted by COVID-19. With 22 sites from Everett to Auburn, YWCA responded quickly to the pandemic and pivoted our programs. We reduced capacity and slowed services, **but the work of YWCA never stopped**.

In 2020, YWCA Seattle | King | Snohomish continued to deliver essential services for over 7,000 women, men, and children across the region.

Today, the long-term effects of COVID-19 have raised implications for the ability of all individuals to survive and thrive in the region. **Yet the pandemic has caused the most harm for low-income households, women, and BIPOC communities – and these populations will face a longer road to recovery.**

PROGRAM HIGHLIGHTS

- Over 275,000 pounds of food distributed through YWCA's Central Area Food Bank.
- Nearly 1,800 job seekers looked for work using a YWCA career center or job bank.
- Over 900 adults and children received domestic violence advocacy services from YWCA.
- Nearly 800 women experiencing homelessness were served at YWCA Angeline's in Belltown.

PARTICIPANT OUTCOMES

- Participants exiting YWCA shelter, diversion, or prevention programs who moved into permanent housing: 73%
- Participants who left a YWCA employment program with increased job readiness: 93%
- Participants in YWCA's domestic violence programs who gained tools to support their personal safety and goals: 100%
