WHAT WE PROVIDE

Once enrolled, an Employment Navigator will help you:

- Discover your professional interests, skills, and goals
- Create effective resumes and cover letters
- Access job listings and job search tools
- Develop and pursue job leads
- Practice interviewing and networking techniques
- Access education and job training opportunities

HOW TO QUALIFY

You are eligible for the employment program if you:

- Live in King County
- Low-Income or Receive government Assistance
- Are 18 or older
- Have a Social Security Card and government issued photo ID
- Authorized to work
- Commit to meeting regularly with an employment navigator
- Men must be registered for Selective Service

GOT THE JOB, NOW WHAT?

Your Employment Navigator will also help continue to develop your workplace skills, including:

- Understanding Employer expectations
- Developing good work habits
- Advancing your career
- Dealing with workplace stress
- Adapting to the workplace
- Communicating effectively with co-workers
